FROM THE PASTOR

Jesus is transfigured before the apostles on Mount Tabor in today's gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent. It was a change for the apostles but more so was indicative of the changes we face in our own lives. Change is inevitable, whether in our personal or professional lives. Life just does not stay static, nor do institutions. Sometimes change is welcomed and other times change is viewed as challenging. Change can be seen as an opportunity to improve or to do things differently.

With change, it is important to have a sense of openness and flexibility which will allow us to see another view and to hear bold new ideas, even if they might make us uncomfortable. Change can also be challenging so it is important to remain focused on your own vision and goals; remain respectful despite any differences that may arise; maintain your integrity; and, at the end of the day, stand up for what you believe to be important.

During times of change, we may not always agree with decisions or directions. At these times it is important to remain respectful despite differences. During those times it is probably wise to keep an open mind and remain reflective. There will be times when you just have to take a leap of faith, believe in others and embrace the change. Our prayer and hope is that we remain open to listening and making the necessary changes the Lord places before us.

<u>Reminder:</u> The *40*-day season of Lent which is 40 days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving begins on Ash Wednesday February 14,2024 and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday, March 28, 2024.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday **are obligatory days of fasting for Catholics from the** age of 18 to 59, meaning only one full meal and two smaller meals not equal to a full meal are permitted. **Abstinence from meat is required of all over age 14**.

The Church asks that, if possible, the fast on Good Friday, the "paschal fast," be continued until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday to honor the suffering and death of Jesus and prepare more fully for His resurrection.

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat from the age of 14.
