FROM THE PASTOR

Growing up as children, many children don't really think much more of Easter than being a time of excessive amounts of chocolate, hot cross buns and a lot of days off school. Parents play the Easter bunny and put chocolate next to the children's beds while they sleep. However, there are far more important miracles that occur at Easter.

One can actually think Easter was actually a really sad time as it is preceded by Good Friday. On Good Friday Jesus died, and not only did he die but he died in one of the most awful ways possible through crucifixion. Prior to this, he was beaten and spat on. What terrible suffering he endured. Moreover, Good Friday is good because when Jesus died, he took on our sin and paid the price of it through his death. If it weren't through Jesus paying the price of death for our sin, we would not be able to be made right with God and have personal relationships with him through Jesus. On the third day, Jesus rose from the tomb. He is alive and he has conquered death. The resurrection of Jesus is an amazing thing to celebrate.
