FROM THE PASTOR

Last Sunday, we celebrated the First Scrutiny with our RCIA Catechumens. There are a series of three on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. This year, a Scrutiny will be done in each of the parishes in our St. Gregory the Great Family of Parishes. The Scrutinies are a series of rites for adults who wish to be baptized. This is considered a period of purification and enlightenment for the elect. There are prayers of exorcism which are intended to help purify the elect from sin and sinful desires. The overall prayers and laying on of hands are to help the elect be enlightened by the Word and grace of God.

The basic structure which takes place immediately following the homily:

- The elect (with sponsors) are invited forward
- Invitation for parish to silently pray for the elect
- Intercessions for the elect
- Prayer of exorcism
- Laying on of hands on the elect
- Prayer over the elect
- Dismissal of the elect

Please keep these catechumens in your prayers as they will be fully initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil. Please keep our candidates in your prayers as they will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil.
