Note from Father Carl:

Saturday and Sunday, June 1st and June 2nd, is the feast of the Body and Blood of our Lord. This is the week-end when we will resume having the chalice of consecrated wine available for all who want to drink from the chalice.

There will be 2 ministers of Holy Communion instead of just 1: the minister (riverside) with host and the minister (Kellogg Ave side) with the Chalice and purificator.

As you know, when the minister says "Body of Christ," we respond "Amen" and bow our heads.

Similarly, when the minister says "Blood of Christ," we respond "Amen" and bow our heads.

Remember, the Lord Jesus Whom we receive is living; where his body or blood is present, the entire Lord Jesus is present.
