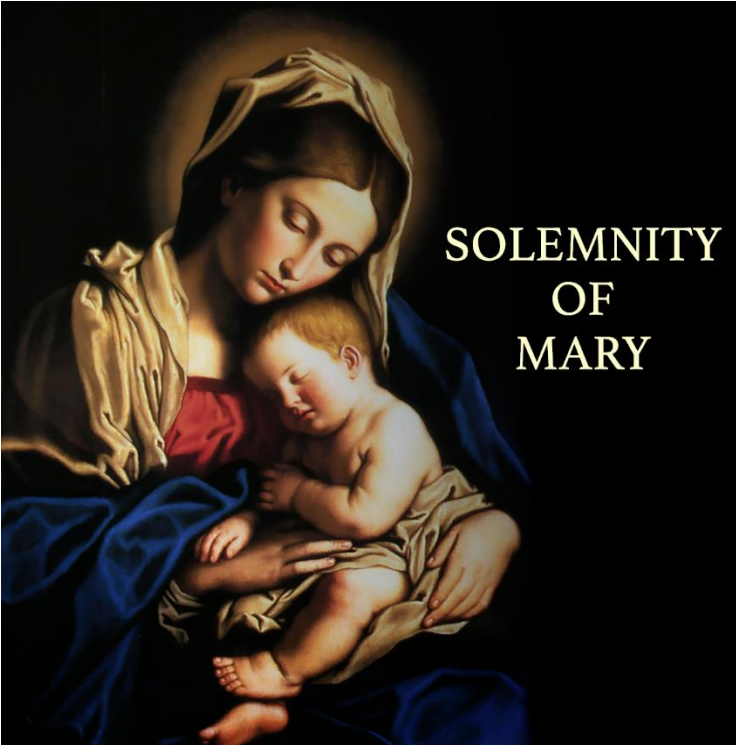

**The Solemnity of Mary, Mother
Mother of God-**

Wednesday, January 1, 2025

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, is significant for several reasons:

1) The feast emphasizes Mary's role as the "Mother of God."

This title was officially recognized at the Council of Ephesus in 431 AD, affirming that Jesus is both divine and human and that Mary, as his mother, is the mother of God in his human form.

2) This feast celebrates the mystery of the Incarnation. By recognizing Mary as the Mother of God, the Church acknowledges the full humanity and divinity of Jesus Christ.

3) The feast is part of Christmastide, a period that celebrates the birth of Jesus. It highlights the ongoing celebration of the Incarnation that began at Christmas.

4) This feast provides an opportunity for reflection on the mystery of Jesus's birth and Mary's part in God's plan for humanity. It also emphasizes themes of peace and new beginnings, fitting for the start of a new year.
