## **FROM THE PASTOR:**

We live in times of violence. The violence of bigotry. The violence of exclusion. The violence of exploitation. The violence of indifference. Tomorrow as the nation celebrates the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., he moved away from the notion that some are more entitled or more privileged than others. He gave his life to the idea that the least of us is deserving of love, respect, and equality. The goal of establishing such a community remains a worthy one. Dr. Martin Luther King lived his life out loud, inviting us into his struggles and fears. No matter how much he was extolled and celebrated, he expressed no scorn for others. Humility guided his steps and respect for others illumined his way. His questioning and thoughtfulness did not diminish him; it elevated him even further as a leader.

Many people fear that we may be moving backward as a nation. What are we to do? Dr. King showed us a way forward instead of a way backward, and his teachings point the way for us. First, he taught us how to be exacting in our expectations of ourselves. Like King, we must rid ourselves of hatred of the other. In the face of death threats and bombings, Dr. King was optimistic. In the face of jailings, Dr. King was optimistic. In the face of "bitter and dangerous adversaries," Dr. King was optimistic. What we must do is to remain optimistic because we are engaged in the struggle to improve lives. What we must do is remain hopeful because we are actively working to surmount obstacles to equality and justice. We must respond by clearing our own hearts of hate.

King was a beacon to the young people of his day. We cannot be the giant that he was but we can speak the truth to power and privilege, claiming the voice that Dr. King called on us to raise in the service of humanity. We can show courage when the rights of others are being denied or stolen. We can be unwavering in our support of love for all people. It is his example that challenges us to renew our commitment to a just world for which he fought and died.
