**FROM THE PASTOR:**

Tuesday, February 11 is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The late Saint Pope John Paul II declared this day a Day of Prayer for the Sick. Illness and suffering is an immutable part of the human condition. The need to endure them in isolation, however, is not. However, illness can also sanctify, reconcile, and open hearts. Pope Francis has said that part of this is the opportunity illness provides us is to truly “walk together” as “companions on the journey.” Our faith calls us to fraternity with the sick.

For Catholic health providers namely, doctors, nurses and those who minister to the sick, this calling takes on even more significance. It motivates them to look for barriers to human accompaniment.
