This Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. Every Memorial Day, we gather to honor and to pray for all those who have made the supreme sacrifice, those who have died in the service of this great nation. May their examples inspire us as we also pray for our men and women in uniform who are who deployed throughout the world. Many of us may recall from our childhood History Classes that Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day. It was established to honor those fallen in battle during our nation's Civil War.
