FROM THE PASTOR:

A man once said, "I know what it's like to be under the influence of alcohol." "I know what it is like to be under the influence of narcotics." "That stuff gave me weird dreams and even made me think my room was on fire." However, has he ever been under the influence of the Holy Spirit. Have you? Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost in the Church, the conclusion of the Easter Season.

What is it like to be under the influence of the Spirit? The prophet, Isaiah, tells us that when the Spirit is upon you, you must heal the broken hearted, do everything you can to free captives, be brave enough to open the eyes of the blind, and show compassion to those who mourn. The prophet, Joel, posits that under the influence of the Holy Spirit old people will dream dreams and young people will see visions.

What if our Church was under the influence of the Spirit today? It might open wide and let all of God's creation in. We might invest ourselves in how to deal with conflict peacefully. We might take meals to or accompany a dying person at a nursing home. Under the influence of the Spirit, we would have to cure our own blindness to so many injustices that even we do not see. We know what it feels like to be under the influence of alcohol or painkillers. We are challenged to pray for our church and one another that we can also know what it is like to be under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

On Tuesday, June 10, we celebrate a Mass at the St. Gregory the Great Chapel at 6:00 pm at Mt. Saint Mary's Seminary with a reception as the St. Gregory the Great Family of Parishes. Please join us!
