**“SERVING THOSE WHO SERVE”** This collection is taken every three years to support, the ministries offered by the **AMS (Archdiocese for the Military Service)** The AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, Veterans, and their families.

The mission of this Archdiocese is to ensure that service members, Veterans, and their families be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, first Communion, penance and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty.

The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains and to serve in parishes and diocese across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or his community of priests.

Please help continue the pastoral care-including the priests who originate from our own parishes and our own archdiocese.

## **FROM THE PASTOR**

What is it that makes your soul beautiful? Prayer. What is it that keeps you from sin? Prayer. What is it that fills you with hope? Prayer. What is it that leads you on the road to holiness? Prayer. Prayer is the key to all things. Without prayer, each and every day, you are directionless in life and are left to your own wisdom and ability, which is a frightening state to find yourself in. Do you spend moments alone speaking to God? Do you allow Him to initiate a conversation of love with you every day and throughout the day? Think about your habit of prayer. Can you honestly say that your daily conversation with God is the most important conversation you have each day. Make this a priority, the number one priority, and all else will fall into place.

Prayer is not always about asking or seeking. Prayer exists as a means by which we are restored to and remain within God's family and are able to sustain a relationship with God, to reverence, honor, and glorify Him. Words, then, are relatively unimportant in a life of prayer. Far more important is the attitude, the intent, the meaning that words can only superficially represent. Prayer is one of the many rays of the powerful light of love connecting lives, expressed in thoughts, attitudes, feelings, and behaviors that are sometimes beyond our own understanding. Thus, the Holy Spirit intercedes on our behalf. The Holy Spirit receives and clarifies our prayers, making them whole, specific, and personal. Simultaneously, the Holy Spirit dialogues with us when we are prepared to be silent and to actively listen to the "Word of the Lord."

Prayer brings balance—balance in life, worship, work, leisure, communication, relationships, race, and community. Prayer leads to inner peace, and that allows outer peace with others. Take fifteen minutes a day this week to pray. Doing this every day will bring a transformation to our lives.
