THE PASTOR

We begin Holy Week today as we celebrate Palm Sunday in which Jesus entered triumphantly into Jerusalem. Holy Week is a proclamation of our salvation. During the liturgies of this week, we encounter the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Lord. During these past 40 days, we entered the desert with Jesus through our prayer, fasting, and works of charity. Now, we are preparing to enter a new life prepared for us all. Holy Week begins with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Here, the Lord encounters the crowd rejoicing at Jesus' arrival in the Holy City. Jesus suffers here because people refuse to accept his words and identity. During our Lenten observances, we have reflected on Jesus' words and his identity as God's son. The goal of Lent was to encounter God in our lives through Jesus.

Jesus' presence in our lives brings spiritual renewal and hopefulness. Even the denial of who he is by many did not stop God's salvation from reaching us all. The washing of the disciples' feet and celebrating the Eucharist at the Last Supper are all signs of God's grace for us.

The painful suffering of Jesus and his crucifixion was a sign of His love for all. The paradox of all that happened to Jesus is to reveal that God loves us all, even unto death on the Cross. Having heard and experienced the events of Jesus' last days on earth, what conversion of mind, heart, and life is Jesus inviting me to experience? What aspect of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection gives me hope? In the upcoming celebrations of Holy Week, Jesus meets us on the road to Calvary. We encounter God's thirst for us. In Jesus's suffering, death, and resurrection, we also discover God's great love for us.

Make this week a retreat by spending some quiet moments reflecting on Christ, the cross, what he has done for us and as a result what we can do for him.
