Pope Leo's Prayer Request for May

That everyone might have food.

Let us pray that everyone, from large producers to small consumers, be committed to avoid wasting food, and to ensure that everyone has access to quality food.

What the Feast of the Ascension Means for Us:

The Ascension is far more than a departure of Easter. It carries several layers of meaning that the Church invites us to contemplate:

- **Christ intercedes for us**

In ascending to the Father, Jesus does not leave us alone — he enters into the heavenly sanctuary to intercede for us continuously. As the Letter to the Hebrews tells us, he lives forever to make intercession for those who approach God through him.

- **He prepares a place for us**

At the Last Supper, Jesus told his disciples: *“In my Father’s house there are many dwelling places. I go to prepare a place for you.”* (John 14:2) The Ascension is the fulfillment of that promise.

- **The Holy Spirit is given**

Jesus told the disciples that it was better for them that he go — because only then would the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, come. The Ascension opens the door to Pentecost.

- **We receive a mission**

Before ascending, Jesus gave his disciples the Great Commission: *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations.”* (Matthew 28:19) The Ascension is the moment the Church receives her mission in the world.

A Prayer for the Feast of the Ascension

*Lord Jesus,
you ascended not to leave us,
but to go before us —
to prepare a place for us.
Teach us not to remain looking at the sky,
but to live the mission you entrusted to us.
Send us your Holy Spirit,
and strengthen our hearts with hope,
until the day we are united with you in glory.
Amen.*
