After 166 years of serving the people of Over-the-Rhine, St Francis Seraph Church is closing. The Franciscan Friars have served here from the beginning. In fact, St Francis Seraph served as the “Mother Church” for the friars of Sy John the Baptist Province. Our province merged with five other provinces in the US three years ago. The new head quarters are in Atlanta, GA.

Like so many other religious communities, our membership is aging and our numbers are a lot smaller than in years past. We are no longer able to staff as many of the ministries as we did in the past. Also, we are unable to afford the upkeep of large buildings such as the friary and church at St Francis Seraph. It is with great sadness that the provincial administration has found it necessary to close the church and friary here and put the property up for sale.

The Faith Community wants to celebrate all that has been. We are inviting all former parishioners, students, teachers and anyone who has had a connection to St Francis Seraph to celebrate with us on Sunday, June 21. Archbishop Casey will celebrate the Eucharist at 10:00 am on that day, A reception will follow.
