THE PASTOR

Back in July, I traveled to the Archdiocese of Esztergom, Budapest in Hungary. Initially, the journey began with a delayed flight to Paris which precipitated a missed connection to Budapest. While awaiting another connection to Budapest in the Paris Airport, I struck up a conversation with a fellow passenger in the same predicament. She said to me, "reflecting on unexpected happenings helps me to reframe life's curveballs." She had a point there. Instead of viewing unexpected happenings as disruptions, we can treat these detours as opportunities to build adaptability, deepen self-awareness, and discover meaningful new paths. Navigating a sudden change forces you to tap into past experiences to "triage" the situation and keep moving forward. Surprises snap you out of autopilot or repetitive mental loops, forcing you into the present moment. Unplanned events quickly highlight your true support systems and what you genuinely value when your plans fail.

While at the Basilica of St. Stephen in Budapest on Sunday at the 10 am Mass with Bishop Gabor Mohos, there seemed to be no unexpected surprises. However at the 4:00 pm Mass the same day, at 3:55 pm, the sacristan told me the Nigerian priest who was to celebrate the Mass had not come yet so it might just be me and I was scrambling to come up with a few inspiring words for a homily when I was informed he arrived just then at 3:58pm. I could breathe easier. Only after participating in this Mass did I learn it was live streamed. So, now I am reading the gospel to all of Hungary. Surprises are all around us.

In our gospel this Sunday, the boat is being tossed and turned. What an unexpected surprise for the disciples. Yet, Jesus calmed the waters and another surprise. What do we do with unexpected surprises? Whatever the emotion, don't immediately jump to negative conclusions as it might be a new opportunity. Focus on what you can control. Pray knowing God is with you every step of the way and his presence is all encompassing. A surprise may be just a miracle sent by God.
