THE PASTOR

This weekend is a packed weekend with the celebration of the Feast of the Guardian Angels at Guardian Angels Parish. The Hal Hustle begins Saturday at 6:00 pm. A Picnic follows the 10:00 Sunday Mass.

Who are the Guardian Angels? No aspect of Catholic piety is as comforting to parents as the belief that an angel protects their little ones. Yet angels are not only for children. Their role is to represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer, and to present their souls to God at death. The concept of an angel assigned to guide and nurture each human being is a development of Catholic doctrine and piety based on Scripture but not directly drawn from it. A feast in honor of the guardian angels was first observed in the 16th century. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar. Devotion to the angels is an expression of faith in God's enduring love and providential care extended to each person day in and day out.

This weekend in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, I will celebrate the Blue Mass at the Cathedral. Blue Mass celebrations are held throughout the United States, usually in a cathedral setting, to honor and pray for the men and women who serve our communities as Police, Fire and Safety personnel. The homily/sermon contains a message of appreciation, encouragement and solidarity with the safety personnel as keepers of order in our civil society and honors them for their value to all the people. Names of deceased personnel from the previous year are read aloud during the liturgy. The Blue Mass occurs annually in September (since 2005 in Cincinnati) because Catholic tradition looks upon St. Michael the Archangel as the patron of Safety Personnel and his feast is celebrated each year on September 29th. The Blue Mass is, as the name indicates, a Mass, the typical Catholic worship service. Others who are not Catholic are cordially welcome to join with the Catholic community in this honoring of and praying for all of our safety personnel regardless of faith or denomination. Many safety agencies send representatives, and their safety vehicles are positioned in front of the cathedral for a blessing prior to the Mass. Bagpipers play and honor guards from Police, Fire and Sheriffs' Departments lead participants into the cathedral for the service.

This weekend, pray for your Guardian Angels and the First Responders who serve us daily.
